


Federated Network of associations

Is the federated network of associations, federations, entities participating in the organization of the Roller In-Line Hockey under the aegis of World Skate, CERS and CERILH, or authorized by them

Why do we need a new system?



Transfers inside the association

An association manages the transfers of players between clubs inside its affiliates and determine the conditions of transfers, based on local laws and its project



A player wants to play for a club in a new association, but was in activity before this in another association (in a club or in a league)





Case of several associations

Player can be referenced in several associations, mainly because a license is valid one year but season are shorter than a year.

So when moving, there is actually no process to "close" a license in one association when a new license is delivered in another one.

Schematically, a player is referenced twice

About FREE MOVEMENT

- We are not against player movement.
- Player's movement is part of In-Line hockey because:
 - Associations do not have a sport offer for players at the same time in a year and sometimes they have a sport offer for players only during a short period.
 - There are so many leagues in the summer that propose really good sport's offer that player want to participate, outside of their engagement with a club
 - We think that, for a player, to engage into different associations to participate to different sport's offers, when the competition's time in not concurrent, is a real opportunity
- We want to promote a dynamic regulation of the "engagement" of a player into a club from an association of our network
- This deals, for a player, with the agility to change associations at a decent price, with a system that secure the club in its risk taken when engaging a player
- This system must be "European Laws" compliant

How to regulate?

 Creation of a certificate to ensure that a player has only one license in one association at a time

 Creation of a set of rules that enables to follow, at the European level, the movement of players, to ensure that a player is not playing, at the same time, in several championships from several associations

Need to be compliant with the European Union laws

ETC and the different cases



A player wants to play for a club in a new association, but was in activity before this in another association (in a club or in a league)

1 player = 1 club = 1 association* at a time

Possibility for a player to change club and association but with respecting a framework of rules in Europe, to manage this engagement with respect to European laws

ETC is this framework




The certificate

For a player to move from one association to another, he needs to be in possession of a certificate to be able to play in the new association. This certificate is the ETC




The transfer from a club not part of the federated network of associations inside Europe

ETC process regarding the different cases

CASE	PROCESS	
CASE 1	The associations (former and new) will treat directly between them and with their clubs. CERILH act to register the ETC in a central database	
CASE 2	The new association will treat with CERILH, the entity that will deliver the ETC and register it in a	
CASE 3	central database. Player must provide a declaration on honour

Process centralized on the new association



In the process, the new association has a work to collect information about the player and money from the club, dispatch those elements between actors

He acts as a caution of the ETC by collecting the fees as soon as the club makes a request for a player

He is in charge of the administrative relation with the club

CERILH proposing some help...



CERILH put in place a couple of online services to help the associations to manage the ETC process, as soon as the club makes a request for a player.

CERILH propose to collect the fees and information as soon as a club requests a ETC for a player (not mandatory, proposed and encouraged)

An advantage is less administrative work for the new association

CERILH' forms



Online forms are proposed to avoid any movement of document between associations.

The goal is to digitalize the entire ETC process for all parties and simplify and secure it at a maximum


Art. 8 - Procedure

- 8.1 When registering a player, the new club informs the new association of the need to receive an ETC for that player.
 - 8.1.1 Only completed applications will be accepted. Any incomplete form will be returned immediately.
 - 8.1.2 Only requests made by e-mail are accepted
- 8.2 Upon receipt of the request, the new association is in charge of making a request for ETC from:
 - 8.2.1 The association of the club left (former association), for the applicant, for the member associations of the federated network of Roller In Line Hockey in Europe. A copy of this application is sent the same day to CERILH
 - 8.2.2 CERILH for associations that are not part of the federated network of Roller In Line Hockey or for associations of the federated network of Roller In Line Hockey organized outside Europe

Art. 8.3 - transfer between associations of the federated network


- 8.3.1 The former association asks the former club and the player to confirm if there is any dispute to prevent the transfer.
- 8.3.2 The former association must establish the ETC within 7 (seven) days of receipt of the application, in favor of the new association
- 8.3.3 .../... (see sections on criteria to refuse the ETC)
- 8.3.4 .../... (see sections on criteria to refuse the ETC)
- 8.3.5 A copy of the ETC confirmed by the former association must be served on the new association. Another copy of the ETC must be sent to CERILH.
- 8.3.6 Proof of payment of transfer fees to the former association and CERILH are attached to the documents served
- 8.3.7 If, within 15 days after the date of the official application issued by the new association, the former association does not issue an ETC certificate for the player or if it has not put forward a relevant reason for the refusal, the new association may, after expiry of the deadline, request the delivery of the ETC from CERILH.
- 8.3.8 The CERILH examines the transfer documents and records in the list of European transfers the transfers in progress

European Transfer Certificate ETC Generator








Art. 8.4 – other transfer cases

- 8.4 Case of a transfer with an association not member of the federated network of Roller In Line Hockey or members of the federated network of Roller In Line Hockey outside Europe
 - 8.4.1 The new association must request ETC from CERILH by providing, in addition to the standard documents of the ETC procedure, a declaration on the honour of the player, showing the following elements:
 - The player assures that he has no license in another country
 - The player ensures that he is not engaged in a sports season with another club, for the Roller In Line Hockey, whether he is a member of the federated network or not
 - The player ensures not to be disciplined for the practice of Roller In Line Hockey, whether sanctioned in the federated network or outside the federated network
 - 8.4.2 The new association sends proof of payment of transfer fees to CERILH
 - 8.4.3 The CERILH shall establish the ETC within 7 days of receipt of the application, in favour of the new association and record ETC in the list of European transfers
 - 8.4.4 .../... (see sections on criteria to refuse the ETC)

From CERILH Players Statutes and Transfers, based on ART. 8.4.1, players under certain circumstancies must provide a declaration on honour before the club can request the ETC for them







Criteria to refuse the ETC

When a ETC is not accorded to a player



Art. 8 – Refusal criteria

- 8.3.3 In the case of a dispute between the club and the player, the former association must inform the new association that the ETC cannot be established, indicating the cause of the dispute
 - 8.3.3.1 Disputes cases can be:
 - The player has not returned his equipment to the club (Club must provide official document proving that the player was in a position of using an equipment that was supposed to be returned)
 - The player has not paid all the money due to the club (Club must provide official document proving that the player is in a situation of dept toward the club)
 - There is an existing contract set between the player and the association and any right cause exist to break this contract
- 8.3.4 The former association must mention in the ETC any suspension or disciplinary proceedings in progress against the player. In such a case, the ETC may be issued but on the expiry date of the current measures. The new association may request additional information from the former association and CERILH.

8.4.4 If information liable to invalidate the player's declaration of honor is collected by CERILH, the ETC cannot be issued.
